Research Focus:

The overarching question that guides my work is: for whom and under which circumstances is well-being optimized? I focus on contextual and individual differences in processes that occur before, during, and after stressors as they relate to well-being outcomes (e.g., physical health, cognition, affect) across the adult lifespan. I use intensive within-person designs and employ multilevel statistical models to examine interindividual differences in within-person changes over time. I consistently find that it is important to simultaneously examine contextual as well as individual components. My work has been featured in respected media outlets such as the *BBC*, *New York Times*, *Time Magazine*, *ABC News*, *CBS News*, and the *Wall Street Journal*. I have over 4900 citations, an h-index of 32, and an i10-index of 56. I have authored or co-authored 88 peer-reviewed journal articles, 10 book chapters, and presented over 175 peer-reviewed papers/posters at scholarly conferences. I also have a demonstrated track record of securing funding for my research, obtaining nearly \$3.8 million in grant funding as PI, Co-I, or consultant. I actively involve students in all areas of my research, evidenced in funded grants and 56 publications with student co-authors.
